- ⑮ Steam Hauler cut - 200-foot long trench dug c. 1912 for ice road

- ⑱ Site of fatal steamhauler accident, March 3, 1914
- ⑲ Kuehling kiosk: 1914 fatal steamhauler accident artifact

Timm's Hill Trail

America's First National Side Trail
Price & Taylor Counties, Wisconsin

Timm's Hill Trail
CTH-C parking area to Timm's Hill terminus: 9.1 miles
via CTH-C alternate route: 8.6 miles

The 50-acre Rusch Preserve is owned by the Ice Age Trail Alliance. It features parking, potable well water, picnic tables, the site of Rib Lake Lumber Company Camp 6 (1911-1914), and camping. There are two camp areas: first, 3 sites called Stille Nacht (Silent Night); these sites are directly south of the water well and are open on a first come first served basis. The second site named Heilige Nacht (Holy Night) is along the combined IAT and THT hiking trail and is reserved for IAT thru-hikers. Every campsite has a metal fire ring, which must be used for any fire.

Permitted Uses

The Timm's Hill Trail is open to non-motorized uses including horse riding and mountain biking except south of Rustic Road #1.

Combined Trail

In the Rusch Preserve, the Ice Age NST and the Timm's Hill Trail overlay and are open to foot travel only at all times of the year.
