
Hike the 28+ miles of the Ice Age Trail that uses the Ahnapee Trail

These segments of the Ice Age Trail are on the "Ahnapee" Trail; a former railroad line located in Door and Kewaunee Counties, Wisconsin.

Ahnapee is an Ojibwe word for "when."

Although these segments allow bicycles, you are expected to walk them to earn the Ahnapee Tracker patch.
