







(BW19) </p>	<p>1081.7 <b>Lake 32 Rd. access (BW19):</b> From Cumberland at STH-48/USH-63, take STH-48 west for 5.0 mi. At 2nd St. turn right and go north 1.6 mi. At 26th Ave. turn left and go west 1.0 mi. At 1st St. turn right and go north 1.5 mi. At 27th Ave. turn right and go east 0.5 mi. At 1st St. turn left and go north 2.5 mi. At 30th Ave. turn right and go east 0.2 mi to the junction with Lake 32 Rd. and the parking area on the corner.</p>	
	<p><i>Note: Dogs should be leashed (8-ft max) and under control at all times. Dogs should stay off portions that overlap with groomed ski trails in winter. The Trail crossing private land (i) east of the end of the gravel road to the Timberland Hills Ski Area western boundary and (ii) east of the Timberland Hills Ski Area eastern boundary to Leach Lake Rd. are closed during gun deer season.</i></p>	<p><b>Timberland Hills and Timberland West ski areas:</b>    On Trail. (1821 Boyd Rd., Barronett, timberlandhills.com). Parking and pit toilets at 3rd St. (CTH-H) and Boyd Ln. On Barron and Burnett County Forest lands. Wide ski trails groomed in winter; usually mowed in summer for hiking. Northeastern area of the property has natural ground springs, with a nearby sheltered picnic table. Basic winter warming hut at Boyd Ln. area.</p> <p><b>Camping:</b> Burnett County Forest primitive camping: Indicated as green dotted area on Atlas map 6f and Guidebook p. 30, 31. Barron County Forestry (715-537-6295, barroncountywi.gov). Burnett County Forestry (715-349-2157, burnettcounty.com; Burnett County Forestry requests walk-in campers call for permission). Practice “Leave No Trace” principles.</p> <p><b>Lodging:</b> Rental lodging available at Burnett County Camper Cabin. Accessible by foot, fat-tire bike, ski or horseback (burnettcounty.com/index.aspx?NID=1148, Rental reservations through Air BnB).</p>

At Leach Lake Rd. turn right and go north then west then north 0.7 mi to the Trail access (look for yellow arrow). Roadside parking.</p>

At Old Hwy. 63 turn right and go south 0.1 mi. At Pershing Rd. turn left and go east 0.7 mi just past W8661 Pershing Rd. to the Trail access parking area.</p>
