Dane County Segment Highlights

Lodi Marsh: This segment begins with a climb through a classic southern Wisconsin woods, intermixed with dolomite rock outcrops. A view to the west offers a striking U-shaped cut between the bluffs, believed to have been formed by a large under-glacier river draining meltwater. Look for the prominent bulge of Gibraltar Rock, and beyond that, the Baraboo Hills. Travel through the Lodi Marsh Wildlife Area, hiking limestone ridges shaped by the Green Bay Lobe.

Springfield Hill: This hike highlights the 198acre Springfield Hill Natural Resources Area which features a wildflower-laden prairie and oak savanna. It also offers ideal winter snowshoeing. The Trail's route provides outstanding views from atop Springfield Hill.

Indian Lake: Enjoy wandering through the Halfway Prairie Wildlife Area where the stone ruins of the Matz farmstead provide an evocative setting for one-of-a-kind photos. Follow the Trail into Indian Lake County Park where it weaves through grassy fields and woods. Eventually, the route winds down to the lake which was formed by melting glaciers. Consider spending an evening lakeside watching the sunset.

Table Bluff: Begin with a lollipop loop through a stunning prairie and continues through Alliance-owned preserves. Traverse steep, rocky slopes, and hike among a colorful profusion of native prairie plants. The southernmost bluff provides a view of Blue Mound, an area landmark.

Cross Plains: The Trail travels through a restored native prairie and over a dolomite ridge before passing by the Alliance

headquarters. Climb to views along a wooded ridge and then wind around Alliance-owned Mammoth's Back Preserve. Follow a connecting route to the NPS Ice Age National Scenic Trail Interpretive Site. Proceed through a prairie to enjoy long views, meander through woods, fields, and hike past rock outcroppings.

Valley View: Hike along the terminal moraine, prairie/oak savanna restorations, and a residential area featuring prairie-style homes inspired by Wisconsin-born architect, Frank Lloyd Wright.

Madison: The Trail ambles through the woods at the edge of the University Ridge golf course until connecting with the Verona Segment.

Verona: The Trail travels through several parks including the Ice Age Junction Area and its restored prairies, passes through Badger Prairie County Park, and ends in the Prairie Moraine County Park. Along the way, enjoy scenic views of the Sugar River Valley and ravines cut through the Johnstown Moraine by glacial meltwater.

Montrose: The views of the Sugar River Valley continue as you climb and descend two plateaus along this segment. Enjoy wooded areas, impressive bedrock outcroppings, and long views.

Brooklyn Wildlife: Dane County's southernmost segment travels through the glacial outwash/sand prairie and across bedrock hills in the Brooklyn State Wildlife Area. Highlights include meadows, woodlands, oak savannas, and colorful prairies.
