This journey all started when I mentioned to my wife, Sarah that I wanted to hike the PCT. She suggested I start with the Ice Age Trail, seeing that it was in our own backyard. We live very close to the Kettle Moraine State Forest and have enjoyed Lampham Peak, Ottawa Lake and Scuppernong for years.

I finally retired and was able to do something for myself. Sarah and I went to Lampham Peak the end of April or beginning of May, for a hike when we saw the Walk the Wauk flyer. After we completed that, it just made sense to continue!
