Project Proposal and Review Form Instructions/FAOs



#### **Instructions**

**Purpose** The purpose of this form is to faciliate and expedite the review and documentation of projects proposed on the IATR. Certain portions of these projects are contigent on seasonal conditions for biological requirements and cultural fieldwork. Therefore, this form and the supporting documentation should be submitted early to facilitate timely determinations.

### What to include in Project Description:

- -Description of Project and the project area
  - •topography (flat, hilly, rolling, steep, etc.)
  - •type of terrain (rocky, sandy, heavily wooded, open, etc)
  - •estimate of slope (0-5%, 5-10%, 10-15%, 15-20%, etc)
  - •plant communities (woodland, pine plantation, wetland, meadow, prairie, etc)
  - •wetlands (present or not present, and their extent)
  - •soils (sandy, clay, well-drained, poorly drained, dry, compacted, etc)
  - •size of project area (in acres)
  - •previous and existing land uses (previously logged, grazed, farmed, graded, currently parkland, old field, etc.)
- -Construction methods (side hill, 4-step, brushed, mowed, turnpike, boardwalk, bridges, etc) along with the location and extent of any ground disturbing activities
- -Tread surface (usually native mineral soils- if gravel, chipped, or paved, etc)
- -Length (in miles)
- -Number of kiosks, interpretive signs
- -Surface type and size of parking area (grass, gravel, paved, # of cars to be accommodated)
- -Type and length of water crossings (puncheon, boardwalks, bridge, etc...)
- -Total disturbed width and height along new trail in feet
  - •(See Chapter 4, page 4 4 of the Ice Age National Scenic Trail Handbook for Trail Design, Construction, and Maintenance for additional guidance)
- -Briefly describe how this project connects with existing segments of the trail previous projects, possible future projects, other local features and plans.
- -Describe how you will access site to complete work
- -Describe materials and equipment that will be used
- -Where and how will refuse be disposed of, will there be hazardous materials? How will hazardous materials be disposed of?

### Maps to Include

- 1. IATA Atlas map showing location of project in a regional context.
- 2. A detailed map of the property or properties involved or "site map."
  - o Location of constructed features (kiosks, water crossings, parking areas, etc.)
  - o The length and location of the proposed new trail and any existing trail in the area.
  - o Maps must include topographic information and be of a scale no smaller than 1:24000 (USGS).
  - O When preparing maps, keep in mind that they will be reproduced in black and white for distribution.
