Caves Creek State Fishery Area: On Route. Off-road exploring opportunity. Access from either side of 5th Ave. and the 5th Ave. parking area. (dnr.wisconsin.gov/topic/Lands /FisheriesAreas/520cavescreek.html). Caves Creek fishery area is high quality trout water. The state ownership is 823 acres of fragmented parcels stretched along the stream's 14-mi corridor. The vegetative cover is rich with diversity with a large portion being lowland brush and swamp hardwoods to upland forests and grasslands. This large, relatively undisturbed wetland provides habitat for many waterfowl. During the fall migration season, it serves as an important staging area for sandhill cranes. Several rare plants and reptiles call this home. Page Creek Marsh is owned by The Nature Conservatory and was designated a State Natural Area in 1996. Go to The Nature Conservancy website (nature.org) and search "Page Creek Marsh" for more information on public access and hiking opportunities. Note: There are no facilities, established hiking trails or signage on the SNA section accessed from connector route.
