New director-nominees

Patty Dreier (Stevens Point, WI; Region 3) has served as Portage County Executive since 2010, advocating strongly for parks, trails, and water resources. Prior to serving in public office, she was very active on the IATA's education committee, served on the IATA Board of Directors, and was active with the local Portage County Chapter.

Edward Madere (Janesville, WI; Region 2) is a retired City Manager with over 35 years municipal experience, which included serving as Village Manager of Shorewood, WI. Ed has been an IATA member since 2009 and currently serves as Rock County Chapter Secretary and is on the IATA Advocacy Committee. Ed is also a Wisconsin City/County Management Association Senior Advisor.
